\* All Entries will be accepted if received by the entry deadline date with full payment.

**Team Entry:** All provincial team members must register through their provincial association. Entries must include:  
Participant's name, address and date of birth  
Complete payment of fees  
Players on a Provincial Team are **not obligated** to enter the Men's and Women's Singles events.

**Team Composition:** Provinces that are not able to field their own Provincial Team can enter a split/combined team with another province (or provinces) that can't field their own team as well.

- The Provincial Associations of the combined team are responsible of communicating with other potential provinces that could field a combined team. TTCAN is **NOT** responsible of coordinating this process.
- The Provincial Associations of the combined team(s) must endorse the combined team entries.
- A province that can't field their own team of 3 players is **NOT** obligated to create a combined team. They can enter their team of 2 players and default the matches according to the format of play.

**"B" Teams:** 8 teams should be formed in each category. If there are more than 8 team, the extra team(s) will be accepted. If there are fewer than 8 teams, provincial "B" teams will be accepted. (See Appendix 1 for details.)

**Uniforms:** Matching uniforms must be worn for team events and all doubles events. It is the responsibility of each team to have 2 sets of matching uniforms one of a dark color and the other a light color.

**7. Eligibility:** All players must be:  
Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (proof of residency will be required for new players)  
Be a member in good standing with a registered Provincial or Territorial Association  
**Players with a Canadian Rating:** A player must represent the province for which he/she is listed on the Canadian Ranking List at the entry deadline.  
**Players without a Canadian Rating:** A player without a Canadian Rating must represent the province where they are a member at the entry deadline.

A player can enter a maximum of 5 events, including a maximum of 1 rating event.  
Youth 21: Players born in 1995 or later

\* The Referee reserves the right to cancel any event due to insufficient entries.



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(minimum 8 entries in singles, 4 entries in doubles)

### 8. Format of play:

The Men's and Women's singles format will be made up of 2 stages.  
Stage 1: RR3/RR4 (2 adv to Championship Division)  
Stage 2: (Championship division and non-Championship Division): single knock out.

All matches will be decided on the best 3 out of 5 games with the exception of the Championship Singles and U21, which will be the best 4 of 7 games as of the knock-out round of 16 (stage 2).

All other events (Double, Age and Rating events) may be made up of round robin and/or knock-out.

The Team format will be the Olympic Team format (3 players, singles and doubles, best of 5 matches).

\*all formats can be modified by the Referee

### 9. Jury Meeting:

**July 4th at 20:00** at Holiday Inn Express (subject to change and room to be confirmed).

The Jury meeting will be chaired by the tournament Referee. Each participating Provincial Association is entitled to one vote.

### 10. First Draws:

The draw will take place the week of **June 20, 2016 (Monday)** and distributed electronically the following week to all Provincial Associations.

Please complete the contact information on the electronic version of the provincial registration forms.

The latest rating period available at the time of the draw shall be used to determine the seeding order for all events.

Whenever possible, players from the same association will be separated in the first round.

Seeding of players shall be based on rating points.

Seeding of doubles shall be based upon the combined rating points of both players.

Seeding of teams shall be based upon the combined total of the three highest players on the team.

### 11. Equipment:

Tables: Butterfly Europa, Blue

Balls: brand to be confirmed - color: white

Floor: Tinsue, Blue

### 12. Awards/Medals:

The Province accumulating the most overall points will be awarded the Margaret Walden Trophy.

Only players listed on the provincial team lists (team event lists) can earn Margaret Walden points for their province.

A "Fair Play Award" will be handed out to the player who demonstrates the most fair play characteristics.

ALL Medal Ceremonies will be held in the Gym at the end of each "Medal Day" (subject to change)

### 13. Entries:

**INDIVIDUAL** Entries for individual events will be accepted if received by the entry deadline date and must include:

- Participant's name, address and date of birth;
- Complete payment of fees (cheque, credit card, money order);
- Clear indication of events entered; and partner identification
- Signature of participant or participant's parents or guardian if under 18.

**TEAM** All provincial team members must register through their provincial association. Entries must include:

- Participant's name, address and date of birth;
- Complete payment of fees (cheque, credit card, money order);
- Clear indication of events entered;
- Signature of participant or participant's parents or guardian if under 18.

### 14. Entry Fee:

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### Appendix 1 - Team Entry

For the team event, 8 teams should be formed in each category. If there are more than 8 teams, the extra team(s) will be accepted. If there are less than 8 teams, the missing team(s) will be created by using the following guidelines:

If there are not 8 provincial teams entered, provinces that have not entered a team may do so by combining players from another province(s) that also has not entered a team (Priority 1). If there are still not 8 teams, provinces that have entered a Provincial Team (non-combined) may enter a "B" team (Priority 2). If more than one province chooses to enter a "B" Team, the highest rated "B" provincial team will be entered. (Ex. If there are only 6 teams entered, the top 2 highest rated "B" teams will be entered). However, before creating "B" Teams, the provincial combined team(s) have the priority. Players on a "B" team cannot have a higher rating than any player on that province's "A" team. Each province can only have 2 teams; one "A" Team and possibly one "B" Team.

Team Format: Men and Women Team events will use the Olympic Team Format (3 players, singles and doubles, best of 5 matches).
